**REPORT OF ACCOMPLISHMENTS  
1<sup>st</sup> Semester, 2007**

**INTRODUCTION**

The Presidential Anti-Graft Commission (PAGC) was created on April 16, 2001 by virtue of Executive Order No. 12 series of 2001. The Executive Order was later amended by Executive Order No. 327 series of 2004 and recently by Executive Order No. 531 series of 2006. Based on the premise that the President's power to remove is inherent to the President's power to appoint, PAGC, serving as the arm of the President to curb corruption is given the authority to:

A. Investigate, receive, gather and evaluate evidence, intelligence reports and information on and hear administrative cases, for acts and omissions constituting violations of a specified set of laws, rules and regulations, against:

1. All Presidential appointees in the Executive Branch of government and any of its agencies or instrumentalities occupying the position of Assistant Regional Director or an equivalent rank, and higher, otherwise classified as Salary Grade "26" and higher, under the Compensation and Position Classification Act of 1989 (Republic Act No. 6758);
2. Members of the governing board of any instrumentality, regulatory agency, chartered institution, and directors or officers appointed or nominated by the President to government owned or controlled corporations, or corporations where the government has minority interest, or who otherwise represent the interests of the government; and
3. Public officers and employees, and private persons, in conspiracy with covered Presidential appointees.

The laws, rules and regulations over which PAGC has jurisdiction include:

1. Republic Act No. 3019, as amended, otherwise known as the "Anti-Graft and Corrupt Practices Act";
2. Republic Act No. 1379 on the unlawful acquisitions of property by a public officer or employee;
3. Republic Act No. 6713, otherwise known as the "Code of Conduct and Ethical Standards for Public Officials and Employees";
4. Any provision under Title Seven, Book Two of the Revised Penal Code;

5. Executive Order No. 292, series of 1987, otherwise known as the “Administrative Code of 1987”, whenever it defines and imposes administrative sanctions on acts and omissions constituting violations of the foregoing laws and issuances;
6. Rules and regulations duly promulgated by competent authority to implement any of the foregoing laws and issuances; and
7. Other violations as may be referred to the Commission by the President of the Philippines.

B. Administratively adjudicate all cases falling within its jurisdiction and shall make decisions in the form of resolutions and recommendations to the President or the Executive Secretary which shall state, among others, the factual findings, legal conclusions and appropriate penalties applicable.

C. Recommend to the President or the Executive Secretary the issuance of an order of preventive suspension against covered Presidential appointees, when the circumstances of the investigation warrant the same.

D. File appropriate criminal complaints with the Office of the Ombudsman or the Department of Justice, or otherwise refer cases for the appropriate action of any such offices or other appropriate Constitutional Commissions or government units, including government owned or controlled corporations, and assist the prosecuting agency or officer towards the successful prosecution of such cases, and monitor the same.

E. Formulate national anti-corruption plans and strategies pursuant to the Medium-Term Philippine Development Plan of the Arroyo administration, and cause the efficient and effective implementation of such plans and strategies.

F. Oversee the implementation of and compliance of all agencies, instrumentalities and offices in the Executive Branch with all anti-graft and corruption laws and issuances and shall secure their compliance with integrity development or enhancement plans.

G. Develop and conduct public awareness and information campaigns, and engage in partnerships or cooperative undertakings with local government units, civil society, people’s organizations, the academe and/or the business sector, to encourage public participation in the government’s anti-corruption efforts.

H. Recommend the issuance and adoption of appropriate policies that would strengthen anti-corruption efforts and hasten the arrest and prosecution of corrupt government officers and employees, including private persons conspiring with them.

## **STRATEGIC SHIFTS**

The problem of corruption is in-depth and systemic, brought on by long years of unaddressed malpractices reinforced by poor accountability and transparency within weak systems. Constant reinforcement further fed into a 'culture of corruption' not just within the bureaucracy but also throughout the country. Thus, to move towards the PAGC's vision of a graft and corruption-free Philippines requires a multi-prong approach.

The bulk of the PAGC's work in the past merely contributed to the disciplining of corruption offenders. Although catching and prosecuting offenders are necessary, it is not sufficient in eradicating corruption. Simultaneous interventions, in adjusting the system to minimize if not at all prevent opportunities for corruption, are equally important. At the same time, an environment supportive of anti-corruption efforts can only be sustained by educating the public on corruption, which includes the various measures being implemented and initiated by the government, as well as by forming people's values leading to a real change in attitude and behavior.

Moved by this reality, the Macapagal Arroyo Administration's Medium Term Philippine Development Plan (MTPDP) of 2004-2010 clearly spelled-out how corruption should be addressed, thus, as specified in Chapter 21 which is on Anti-Corruption, to wit, "*the anti-corruption fight will focus on three areas of reform: (1) Punitive measures that include effective enforcement of anti-corruption laws...; (2) Preventive measures that include the strengthening of anti-corruption laws, improvement of integrity systems, conduct of integrity development review...; (3) promotion of zero-tolerance for corruption...*" and in Chapter 22 on Bureaucratic Reforms, "*To improve the quality and efficiency of public service, the government shall adopt institutional improvements in the bureaucracy*". These developments paved the way for the Strengthening of PAGC as an Organization and its mandate as the amendments have already been effected by the President, ie. Executive Order Nos. 327, 531 to cover not only investigation but prevention and education strategies as well, with strategic partnership cutting across each of the three strategies.

To respond to the new thrust and expanded responsibility, PAGC is in the process of strengthening its internal capability by hiring more investigators, creating new offices/divisions/units; and beefing up of its administrative support.

## **VISION**

A graft and corruption-free Philippines characterized by transparency and accountability in governance, honesty and integrity in the bureaucracy in a corruption-intolerant society.

## **MISSION**

To be the President's arm in eradicating corruption through effective deterrence (investigation and enforcement), prevention and education in partnership with all stakeholders.

## GOALS

- Deterrence (Investigation and Enforcement)
  - To make graft and corruption a high-risk low Reward activity
- Prevention
  - Minimize opportunities for graft and corruption and ensure that systems of agencies are corruption-resistant
- Education
  - To promote a corruption-intolerant society by raising awareness that mobilizes citizenry and by disseminating good citizenship values and institutionalizing the code of ethics in agencies.

## INVESTIGATION

### Resolved Cases

From January to June 2007, the Investigation Office was able to resolve a total of sixty six (66) cases. Of the sixty six (66) resolved cases, thirty one (31) or 46.97% carried punitive (P) recommendations and thirty five (35) or 53.03% carried non-punitive (NP) recommendations.

### Partnership

To facilitate the investigation process particularly in the conduct of lifestyle checks, PAGC forged formal partnership with the **Anti-Money Laundering Council (AMLC)** on 18 January 2007. Likewise, to track the status of PAGC sourced cases in the Court of Appeals and in the Supreme Court a Memorandum of Agreement with the **Office of the Solicitor General** was signed on 01 March 2007. Partnerships in the pipeline to support the investigation operations of the Commission include those with the **National Bureau of Investigation (NBI)**, **Criminal Investigation and Detection Group (CIDG)** and the **Dilaab (Barug, Filipino!)** together with the **Philippine National Police Values and Leadership School**.

## **PREVENTION / EDUCATION**

### *Implementation of the Integrity Development Action Plan*

The Integrity Development Action Plan (IDAP) which has been adopted as the national anti-corruption framework of the executive branch during the closing ceremonies of the 15-17 December 2004 unprecedented Presidential Anti-Corruption Workshop initially implemented in 40 agencies is currently being implemented by 120 agencies/regional offices/bureaus in the executive branch.

The IDAP embodies the multi-pronged strategy in fighting corruption which includes prevention (systems reform to minimize opportunities for graft and corruption), education (values formation and advocacy), investigation and enforcement/deterrence (making corruption a high-risk, low reward activity) and strategic partnership (enjoining the support of the public and all stakeholders towards the fight against graft and corruption).

### *IDAP Briefings*

The conduct of special IDAP briefings in different agencies and organizations enables the Commission to present the anti-corruption national framework of the government in a more in-depth manner. Thus, giving agencies a clearer understanding on the why's and how's of implementing the plan. Moreover, it provides agencies with the idea on how to relate each IDAP measure in addressing the agency's corruption vulnerabilities and in improving the agency's operations.

The Prevention/Education Office ensures that the agencies are given a clear grasp on the IDAP's 22 measures, the IDAP Indicators, and how the agencies are ranked and rated. The Office also ensures that the agencies are properly guided in reporting their IDAP progress and/or accomplishments to the Commission and that they realize the significance of the Integrity Development Action Plan in their fight against corruption.

Briefings are attended by top officials and employees who have the capacity, capability, and responsibility to effect and monitor IDAP implementation in their agency thereby allowing them to point out possible hindering factors that they may encounter.

IDAP-covered agencies are regularly gathered to share best practices on their anti-corruption initiatives and to provide them with information for them to better appreciate each IDAP measure. It also serves as a venue for them to raise concerns and difficulties encountered in implementing the Plan.

**PAGC-WB Project on Strengthening of Internal Audit Units for Effective Procurement Monitoring and Enforcement**

This project is the first of its kind in the entire history of internal auditing in the Philippines. **Php 1 Billion Anti-Corruption Fund Given by H.E. President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo**

President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo on 19 June 2006 announced the allotment of a PhP1 billion fund to cover the various anti-corruption projects of the Executive Department with PAGC at the helm to ensure efficient coordination of efforts. Some of these anticorruption programs include the roll out of the Integrity Development Action Plan or IDAP in all agencies nationwide, focusing on projects and activities heavy on systems improvement, on values formation, moral recovery, capability building for investigators to ensure air tight cases, and shall likewise cover high impact anti illegal drugs campaign and other equally directly responsive projects for the next two years.

The priority projects on a per agency beneficiary include:

**1) Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA)** – which is given P407 million for its project on the “Strengthening of PDEA and Integrity/Accountability Development Program,” which aims to have an increase in the number of successful operations and prosecution of drug cases, increase public trust in drug law enforcement and public participation in the anti-drug campaign, and to have no PDEA agent involved in any irregularities. Aside from capacity building of the agency as a whole, included in the project package are construction of evidence storage and destruction facilities, establishment of information systems enhancement program, and activation of the PDEA Operation “Private Eye” Reward Committee and Court Watch Project

**2) Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR)** - with a share amounting to P153 million to help fast track implementation of projects under its RATE’s or Run After Tax Evaders’ program. The desired outcomes of BIR’s anti-corruption project include: a strong system of internal control, improved risk identification and risk management, increased number of quality and timely audits and audit reports released to serve as an effective management tool, improved proficiency in graft detection and prevention, reduced incidence of violations of administrative policies and controls, increased productivity of the investigators and hearing officers, increased transparency and accountability of Investigating and Hearing Officers, and efficient and effective prosecution of tax evasion cases.

**3) Bureau of Customs (BOC)** - is given P105 million for its project on “Enhancing Integrity in Customs”. Its deliverables includes improvement in the capacity and strengthening of capability of the Legal Service in handling cases under the RATS or Run After The Smugglers program and corollary projects financed under the Millennium Challenge Account Program for the Philippines; improvement of the auction and cargo disposal process and development of operations manual to make day to day operations less vulnerable to corruption risks, thereby resulting in an increased revenues from auction proceedings in all ports by not less than 20%; operationalization of the BOC training center to lower training costs and provide extensive training and development programs for customs personnel to improve capacity, competency and integrity; strengthen capability of the Internal Control Office to improve processes and systems based on results of audits; and to come out with a BOC Communication Plan to enable the Bureau to consistently inform its stakeholders of the Bureau’s initiatives on anti-corruption, with the end view of helping reverse the negative perception not because of sanitized reports but by cascading to every single individual positive and real developments in all transactions.

**4) PCVF or the Presidential Council for Values Formation** is given P60.5 million-its project, “Fighting Corruption thru Values Formation” aims to establish a sustainable, programmatic values formation program in government, and increase support of private sector and civil society for government values program and reform initiatives.

**5) PNP or the Philippine National Police** gets P37.0 million for their PNP Anti-Kotong TXT Project which aims to charge erring personnel, prevent occurrence of “kotong”, widen the capability of the system to accommodate complaints, and improved skills in handling cases and increase in conviction rate.

The balance of over P200 million is administered by PAGC for the projects earlier mentioned and for all other projects that need to be done as an offshoot of the current programs being implemented. Part of the budget shall likewise be used for the development and implementation of a Communication and Advocacy Plan for the anti-corruption efforts of the Executive Branch which aims to: a) develop a strategic communications plan that will effectively relay the message that the projects under the Php1 billion fund are not just mere rhetoric nor lip service; b) to enjoin the support of the wider public (including the media) through the effectiveness of the activities identified in the communications plan.
